<p>Following the success of 2022-2023 SLT, all Years from 2 to 6 will be receiving some SLT. High quality, teacher led small tuition groups in maths and English. Class teachers being released to target reading tuition in Year 2 to ensure highly targeted tuition were particularly successful last year and this approach will be used again.</p> <p>FFT Aspire data and discussions with teachers have been used to identify needs of PP eligible pupils and to plug gaps in learning.</p>	<p>EEF – Pupil Premium Guidance Evidence consistently shows the positive impact that targeted academic support can have, including on those who are not making good progress across the spectrum of achievement. Classroom teachers and teaching assistants providing targeted academic support, including how to link structured one-to-one or small group intervention to classroom teaching, is likely to be a key component of an effective Pupil Premium strategy. Small group tuition approaches support pupils to make effective progress by providing intensive, targeted academic support to those identified as having low prior attainment or at risk of falling behind. The approach allows the teacher to focus on the needs of a small number of learners and</p>	1, 3

	<p>provide teaching that is closely matched to pupil understanding. Small group tuition offers an opportunity for greater levels of interaction and feedback compared to whole class teaching which can support pupils to overcome barriers to learning and increase their access to the curriculum.</p>	
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
